Jury Decision on Protest filed by Pilot #40, David Strasmann, Germany concerning his result in Task #7

Present were:

Thomas Fink, Jury President John Grubbstrom, Jury Member Luc van Geyte, Jury Member David Bareford, Event Director Marcos Mezo, Deputy Chief Scorer David Strasmann pilot #40

The Jury President stated that the complaint and protest procedures had been followed in accordance with the FAI Sporting Code and the Rules for the Event. Then he asked the competitor if he wished to withdraw his protest. He declined to do SO.

The Jury invited both the Competitor and the Event Director to summarize the complaint and the reply and to provide any additional information.

The fact, that the official Logger and the private FAI-Logger of the pilot produced different results, in particular when stronger climbrates occur is undisputed.

The pilot claimed that his official logger failed and that he therefore used his own logger. The director said, the logger did not fail recording the track, but only the USB-Port in connection with the personal equipment of the pilot failed. According to rule 6.13.1 "reported malfunctions are considered failures only when they can be reproduced after flight", which was not the case.

Therefore the Jury deliberated and unanimously concluded :

The protest will not upheld.

The Protest Fee will be kept and sent to FAI.
